PROGRAMME FEES

Voluntary Health Scotland has secured funding from the Scottish government to provide learning opportunities for voluntary health organisations.

This programme is therefore available to 28 learners at no cost to your organisation (usually costing £1,200 per person).

OUALIFICATION

By completing this programme, you are eligible to achieve an Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM) Award in Leadership (SCQF 9) qualification.

To achieve the qualification, you must attend the whole programme and complete one assessment. This is subject to an ILM registration and marking fee of £100, which is not covered by VHS funding.

This programme is designed for senior managers and leaders of voluntary health organisations in Scotland that are seeking to grow, develop and work in partnership, whether in an influencing role or service delivery basis.
