The new <u>film</u> from Ken Loach, is about a woodworker who can't work. After a severe heart attack, Daniel has been advised by his doctor to take a break from manual labour for the good of his health.

The 59-year-old widower should be eligible for Employment and Support Allowance to tide him over, but the welfare state thinks otherwise, and shuffles him on to Jobseeker's Allowance instead.

Here, the thumb-felt certainties of carpentry are supplanted by vague talk of "clients" and "service users" and the pursuit of employment becomes nothing more than a lip-service ritual to unlock the next monthly payment.




#### Age Distribution of A&E Attendances; 2013

Age of patients attending A&E




#### Patient Multiple Attendance Rate per 1,000 Population

#### Alcohol-related Admissions rate per 1,000 and % of Admissions


Admissions with diagnosis related to alcohol based on ISD definition


