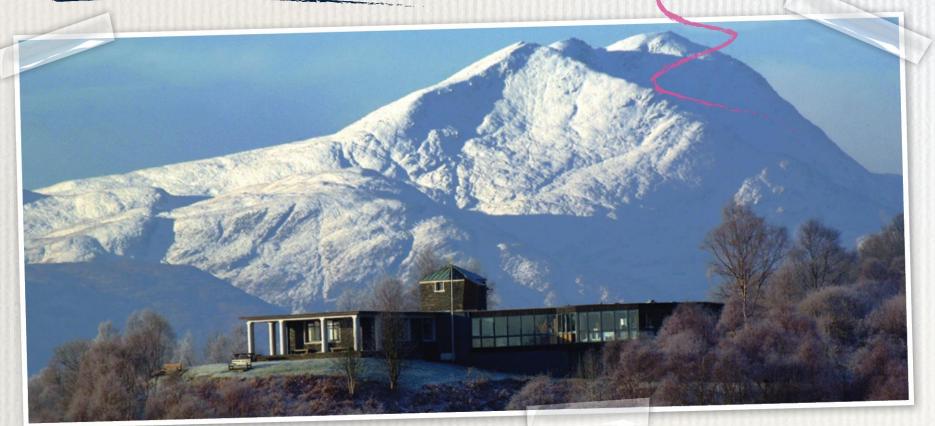




RISK AND REPUTATION

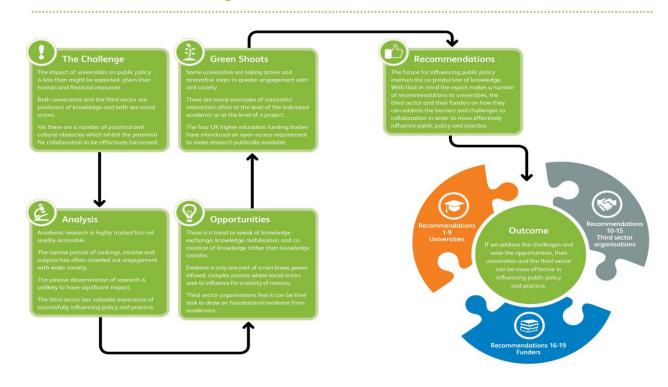
