### Aphasia iPad Group

- Original members came from Dundee's Speakability Group;
- Organised in collaboration with NHS Tayside's Speech and Language Therapy (SLT) department;
- Motivated by a patient who bought an iPad independently and lobbied for the use of iPads to support people with aphasia.

#### Focus Group review:

- "Start & New": "work on an 'App' that allows using the iPhone/iPad to inform quickly on aphasia" December 2013

## The Tayside Healthcare Arts Trust (THAT)

- Charitable organisation, established in 2002;
- Developing the role of the arts in healthcare across Tayside;
- Working to improve the health and wellbeing of people with a variety of Long Term Conditions and enhance the quality of healthcare environments:
- Activities include: Screen Printing, Orchestral Music, Stop Animation and Painting.

## Project: Create a Stop Animation Movie using iPads

- Use your own iPad to create a stop animation movie;
- Eight sessions;
- Public viewing at the end of workshop;
- Evaluations of benefits.





## The Animation Workshop

- NHS Tayside funding via ST/ART Project;
- Eight 2h sessions once a week with
- Stop Animation Filmmaker Andrew Low:
- Seven participants with aphasia;
- Documented by filmmaker Steve Soave;



## Three films produced:

- 90 sec "I have Aphasia" introduce yourself movie;
- 6 min movie "Aphasia in our own words", reflecting Aphasia, featuring the members of the group;
- Behind the scenes documentation "Aphasia Telling our Story"; Movies shortlisted at the ISAAC Short Film Festival 2018.

- Collaboration with independent app developer, dogfi.sh;
- User centred design:
- Use cases: Exploring how the app could be used;
- Iterative prototype development and testing;
- Input from all stakeholders: Users, SLTs, User Interface developers
- Publication on iTunes/App Store (currently only on iOS Apple Inc. devices, planned to be released on Android).
