Background

Waverley Care is Scotland's leading charity providing support to people living with, or affected by, HIV and hepatitis C.

The people we work with face a number of physical, emotional and social challenges linked to living with chronic and highly stigmatised conditions.

This can undermine a person's self-confidence and skills in engaging in everyday life, and can lead to feelings of depression, isolation and exclusion.

Our art project works with a number of sessional artists, and gives people access to a range of creative activities, including painting, photography, music and drama.

Through these activities, service users are supported and encourgaed to express what living with HIV or hepatitis C means to them, while accessing valuable peer support.

The project helps people to build their self-confidence, learn new skills in a safe, relaxed environment, and build resilience to the challanges posed by living with HIV or hepatitis C.
