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COVID-19 pandemic



Over 45,000 deaths in the UK directly attributable to COVID-19

As of 29 October

- 45,955 deaths across the UK
- 4,482 deaths in Scotland
- And we now have the highest number of cases since the pandemic began



Pre-pandemic



- Scotland faces severe health inequalities such as:
 - Deprivation
 - Homelessness
 - Drug and alcohol dependency
 - Stalling life expectancy
- Rising rates of child poverty
- These inequalities have been exacerbated by austerity



Impacts of COVID-19 that will hit communities



- Further waves of COVID-19 will result in
 - Increased self-isolation for some
 - Reduced earnings and growing unemployment
 - Increased homelessness
 - o Poor mental health
 - Increased deaths
