About the IHA

- 1. The Inequalities in Health Alliance (IHA) is calling on the government to do three things as quickly as possible:
 - develop a cross-government strategy to reduce health inequalities
 - commence the socio-economic duty, section 1 of the Equality Act 2010
 - adopt a 'child health in all policies' approach.
- 2. COVID-19 has exposed how health inequalities can have a devastating impact in just a matter of weeks. The IHA is calling for the government to urgently bring forward a cross-government strategy to reduce health inequalities as part of any post-pandemic planning.

Why are we calling for these things?

- 1. ...a cross-government strategy is required because health inequality is the result of many and varied factors. To reduce health inequalities, we must look beyond the Department of Health and Social Care.
- 2. ...the socio-economic duty is key to ensure that the needs of vulnerable people, who can all too often be forgotten, are considered in every decision.
- 3. ...the pandemic has again reminded us of the importance of high levels of general good health this begins in childhood. Public policy must ensure every child has the best chance of good health throughout their life.
- 4. ...which is why...
 - ...we are members of the Inequalities in Health Alliance, a coalition of over 130 organisations focussed on improving the health of the nation
 - ...the government must commit to bring forward a cross-government strategy to reduce health inequalities
- 5. ...so will the government/prime minister...
 - ...commit to bring forward a cross-government strategy to reduce health inequalities?
 - ...commit to meet with the Inequalities in Health Alliance?
 - ...set out his plans to tackle health inequalities which have been exposed and exacerbated by the pandemic?



The #COVID19 pandemic has exposed and amplified underlying inequalities in our society, including in health.


