Partnership & Collaboration

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Multi-agency working

Drawing on a range of knowledge, expertise, resources and relationships

Example: Partnering with The Edinburgh & Lothian's Health Foundation to develop the microgrant scheme

Recognising diversity

Identify unique barriers and unique facilitators faced by different populations may face in COVID-19 vaccinations

Example: Multi-partnership collaboration (e.g. MEHIS, Interpretation Services) to make vaccination information available in a range of formats

Flexible delivery models

You had to take **bespoke action** to deliver COVID-19 vaccinations to **overcome barriers** and **maximise facilitators** for different population sub-groups

Example: Vaccinating people experiencing homelessness

Data driven action

Using real-time data on vaccine uptake by basic demographics (age, sex, ethnicity, geography) to highlight population sub-groups for whom additional support is required

Example: Using data to inform mobile vaccination unit locations

Equitable resource allocation

For populations who experience the greatest barriers, greater resource is needed to promote and support vaccine uptake

Examples: partnering with local faith leaders to host community clinics

Embracing the learning cycle

Drawing on past experience, so that the next time is more effective, acceptable, efficient, equitable and appropriate

Example: learning from outreach clinic experiences
