



# Group of MSPs with cross-party representation (usually 5 to 10 MSPs)

- Currently 16 Committees
- Several simultaneous meetings in the morning of business days (Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays) – Timeeffective system
- Key role in law-making: successful bills will have Committee input at least twice in the process
- Key role in the scrutiny of the work of the Scottish Government.

### Inquiry into health inequalities

#### Overview

The Health, Social Care and Sport Committee is undertaking an inquiry into health inequalities in Scotland.

Public Health Scotland define health inequalities as the "avoidable and unjust differences in people's health across the population."

Some variations in health may be naturally occurring and unavoidable. However, health inequalities are defined as such when they affect certain groups in a way that is unfair and avoidable.

#### Aims:

The aim of this inquiry is to explore progress towards tackling health inequalities in Scotland since 2015. It will explore any cross-sectoral work undertaken over that time period to address social inequalities and what impact this has had on health inequalities.





### **Public Petitions**

### **Purpose**

- get issues onto the Parliament's agenda
- get questions answered by relevant stakeholders
- provide insight into issues that matter to the people of Scotland

### Requirements

- ONE signature and any topic can be considered, as long as it...
  - has national impact, not a local matter, individual/personal case
  - has been raised and received a response from a decision-maker
  - is within the scope of a devolved issue





### **Public Petitions**

- No lower age limit
- Any language (translation is provided) and in paper form
- Admissible petitions will be published and considered
- Number of signatures does not determine the outcome
- Committee will always receive a response from Scottish Government

### New Online Public Petitions System

 Start of Session 6, more accessible in terms of guidance and improved use on mobiles phones and tablets





- 8 MSPs
- Meet <u>them</u> in person
- Bring 'Lived Experience'
- Do your homework
- Have clear, specific objectives
- Be prepared to listen
- Be realistic about outcomes
- Link-up with other groups
- Ask parliamentary staff

### What is SPICe?




We work here (when not in a global pandemic)

### **SPICe Structure**

Around 50 staff - 15 library staff (enquiries and collections) and 35 in research. Research
is divided into five units:

**Enquiries and collections** 

Environment, Rural, Constitution and International Research

**Justice and Social Affairs Research** 

Health and Social Care Research

**Financial Scrutiny** 

**Data Visualisation Team** 



### What does SPICe do?

- Answering MSPs' confidential enquiries (around 400-500 per month)
- Research support to parliamentary committees
- Proactive briefings and blogs
- Petitions briefings and material for debates
- But also other work research support for the Parliament as an institution
- Liaising with stakeholders/academics/Scottish Government and agencies to ensure knowledge and understanding is up-to-date
- Commissioning academic research/academic engagement
