Sharing accurate and up-to-date information is a vital part of what we do, that's why we're spreading key information about breast awareness, breast cancer and breast screening. We're training people across different healthcare professions and local communities, so awareness and risk reduction messages can spread through day-to-day conversations or at dedicated events. By working together, we can help increase breast awareness and breast checking behaviours.

WHAT'S TRAIN THE TRAINER?

Train the Trainer is a pilot programme which we're trialling between August 2024 and August 2027.

It aims to increase breast awareness and attendance at screening appointments. We're training healthcare and community professionals like you about key awareness and risk reduction messages. Once trained, we'll support you to engage with your community in ways that suit you. And you'll have access to a community grant fund and physical and online resources.

IN SCOTLAND, EVERY YEAR AROUND 4,800 PEOPLE ARE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER



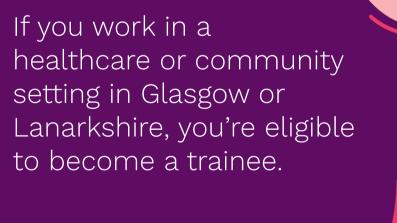

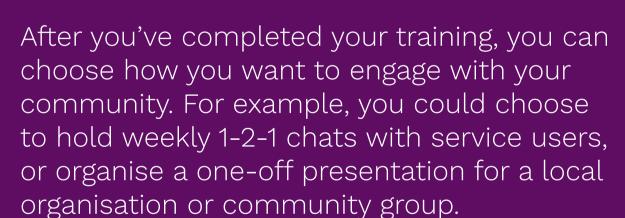
You can attend a face-to-face workshop or complete the eLearning course.

- Breast cancer risk factors and myths
- The NHS Breast Screening Programme

We'll also ask you to record any feedback, so we can keep reviewing the pilot programme.

You'll have access to our online learning hub, where you can connect with other trainees to share ideas and co-host events.

You'll also have access to our community grant fund, which can be used for:

- Venue hire
- Refreshment costs
- Interpretation or translation services
- Printed or digital promotional material

To help us shape the future of our Train the Trainer programme, we'll ask you to update us about the successes and challenges you've faced.

Everyone involved in this pilot will have a strong knowledge of the ways their communities engage with breast health information. Through successful collaboration, we hope to see an increase in breast awareness, early detection and improved outcomes for people affected by breast cancer.
