Community Link Workers

We are commissioned to deliver Community Link Workers who are pased in GP practices across Inverclyde o mitigate the impact of the social determinants of health in our local patient population.

Community Link Workers provide a wrap-around service within the GP multidisciplinary teams which links Primary Care more closely with community resources for the benefit of patients.

Community Link Workers enable patients to feel more supported in the knowledge they can access quick response support vith the non-clinical issues they are facing which can impact their overall health and wellbeing.



We build relationships with our patient population by active listening, identifying heir priorities and discussing options or progression – this ensures our nteractions are person-led, encourages nformed decisions and supports patient empowerment.

Community Link Workers actively engage vith local organisations, projects and resources to ensure we have up to date and relevant information about local and national provision that can be shared vith our patient population through GP practices.



Community Link Workers participate in ocal network and strategic meetings to be included in local decision-making processes and ensure feedback about atient experience is being heard.

Community Link Workers provide opportunities for early intervention and prevention work to be done to avoid escalation to other health and care services.

1573 patients supported from across 13 GP practices in Inverclyde

6602 encounters/contacts with patients;

4187 onward referrals to the appropriate agencies for patients


